Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve




Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area





Fig.3 Typical Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width

Fig.4 Typical Output Characteristics(I)




Fig.5 Typical Output Characteristics(II)





Fig.6  $T_{vj} = 25^\circ C$  3rd Quadrant Characteristics

Fig.7  $T_{vj} = 150^{\circ}\text{C}$  Typical Output Characteristics(I)




Fig.8  $T_{vj} = 150^{\circ}\text{C}$  Typical Output Characteristics(II)




Fig.9  $T_{vj} = 150^{\circ}\text{C}$  3rd Quadrant Characteristics





Fig.10 Body Diode Forward Voltage vs. Gate - Source Voltage

Fig.11 Typical Transfer Characteristics (I)




Fig.12 Typical Transfer Characteristics (II)




Fig.13 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature





Fig.14 Transconductance vs. Drain Current

Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate - Source Voltage




Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.17 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current





Fig.18 Normalized Drain - Source Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.19 Typical Capacitance vs. Drain - Source Voltage




Fig.20 C<sub>oss</sub> Stored Energy






Fig.21 Dynamic Input Characteristics

Fig.19 Typical Switching Time vs. Drain Current




Fig.20 Typical Switching Loss vs. Drain - Source Voltage




Fig.21 Typical Switching Loss vs. Drain Current





Fig.22 Typical Switching Loss vs. External Gate Resistance

Fig.1-1 Gate Charge and Switching Time Measurement Circuit




Fig.1-2 Waveforms for Switching Time




Fig.2-1 Switching Energy Measurement Circuit




Fig.2-2 Waveforms for Switching Energy Loss




Fig.3-1 Reverse Recovery Time Measurement Circuit







Fig.3-2 Reverse Recovery Waveform


