






Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve Fig.2





Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig.5 Avalanche Energy DeratingCurve vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.6 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.7 Typical Output Characteristics(I)







Fig.8 Typical Output Characteristics(II)



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Fig.9 Gate Threshold Voltage









Fig.11 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current








Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current

Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage





Fig.15 Typical Capacitance




Fig.16 Switching Characteristics






Fig.17 Typical Gate Charge




Fig.18 Source Current vs. Source - Drain Voltage Fig.19 Reverse Recovery Time vs. Source Current

Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




Fig.4-1 Reverse Recovery Time Measurement Circuit




Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms




Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform




Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform







Fig.4-2Reverse Recovery Time Waveform







