





Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area





Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width


Fig.4 Single Pulse Maximum Power dissipation





# Fig.6 Typical Output Characteristics(II)




## Fig.7 Breakdown Voltage vs. **Junction Temperature**



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


# Fig.8 Typical Transfer Characteristics

Fig.11 Drain Current Derating Curve




Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage





Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature





Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)

Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)


Fig.17 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (IV)








Fig.21 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage






Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




#### Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms

#### Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform







