



Fig.1 Relative Output Current vs.Distance




Fig.2 Forward Current vs.Ambient Temperature




Fig.3 Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage





Fig.4 Power Dissipation / Collector Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature

Fig.5 Relative Output vs. Ambient Temperature Fig.6 Col




Fig.6 Collector Current vs. Forward Current




Fig.7 Output Characteristics





Fig.8 Dark Current vs. Ambient Temperature



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
